Secure Tax Credits

Passenger Vehicle Federal Tax Credit: Many new vehicles can receive up to \$7,500 in federal tax credits.

Home Charging Incentive: EV owners who install charging equipment in their home may qualify for a federal tax credit.

Plan for Home Charging

Ameren Illinois recommends that you use an Illinois Commerce Commission certified EV charging installer. A list of qualified installers can be found on the ICC website: icc.illinois.gov/authority/electric-vehicle-charging-station-installer.



Level 1 Charging occurs at 120 volts, similar to a conventional household outlet, and provides 3-5 miles of range per hour.



Level 2 Charging uses 240 volts and provides roughly 25 miles of range for each hour of charge time. Operating with energy use similar to a major appliance, Level 2 chargers can be installed at homes, workplaces, or public settings.



Level 3 Charging, also known as "DC Fast Charging," can provide a full charge in 30-45 minutes. Fast charging is becoming increasingly common as an amenity in public and even at some workplaces.

If you aren't able to charge at home, apps like <u>PlugShare</u> and <u>ChargePoint</u> can help you identify nearby chargers by type and status.



Sign Up for Roadside Assistance

Many manufacturers offer roadside assistance for EVs. Make sure that you understand your manufacturer's programs and are participating if appropriate for you. Also, AAA and other companies are providing new assistance for EV drivers. Check out AAA programs.
